Re: Nomination List for **2021-22** Awards

We invite you to submit eligible titles (see criteria below) to the Hackmatack Award selection committees for the 2021-22 awards. The committees will review all eligible submitted titles to arrive at shortlists of 10 English fiction, 10 English nonfiction, 10 French fiction, and 10 French nonfiction Canadian books suitable for children in grades 4 to 6 (ages nine to twelve). The nominated books will be read in the 2021-22 school year by thousands of children in the Atlantic region. Young readers will vote for their favourite book in each of the four categories, and the four winners will be announced at the Hackmatack Award Ceremony in spring 2022.

The selection committees are in three provinces. Please note the different shipping addresses for each category.

SELECTION CRITERIA HACKMATAACK CHILDREN'S CHOICE BOOK AWARD PROGRAM

Books **MUST**:

- have been published in Canada within the last two years (2019 or 2020)
- be appropriate for readers in grades 4 to 6
- have been written by no more than two Canadian authors
- be in print and readily available (**Please do not submit books not available in sufficient quantities!**)

Committees look for:

1. Atlantic-Canadian content, authorship, illustrations, and/or publication

This is **not a requirement**, but a book with Atlantic content would be chosen over another if the two were equal in every other regard.

2. Literary Quality

- authority
- organization
- illustrations
- design
- prose style
- documentation

3. Overall appeal to children in grades 4 to 6 (ages 9 to 12)

4. Author is of a background that is a visible or cultural minority or Indigenous

*** If an author is from such background, please be sure to indicate this clearly in the submission.** Ensuring that students feel that their race, culture, and identity are affirmed by the books they read is important. We support the policies within the education system that ensure that books and materials used in schools reflect this cultural diversity.

5. Other Factors

- authors who are culturally diverse
- range of reading levels for the Grade 4-6 age group
- content appealing to both boys and girls
